- ✓ Applicants can have a <u>maximum of 10 years' post-qualification experience</u>. Practising lawyers and trainee lawyers will be given preference; however applicants with other relevant backgrounds will be considered (such as activists in relevant NGOs).
- ✓ All applicants must be <u>fluent in English</u> as the training will <u>only</u> be delivered in English.
- ✓ Applicants must show a specific interest in criminal law, human rights and civil liberties.

 - 2) an up-to-date CV;
 - 3) a copy of your Practising Certificate; and
